

## From the Principal's office

#### Dear PRA Families:

I am writing to address a serious situation on our campus that puts student safety at risk every morning. There are parents who bypass our drop-off lane and let their children out of the car in the left-hand lane. These children have to dodge moving cars to reach the safety of the sidewalk. This is unacceptable. You may not stop to the outside of the drop-off line and have your children cross traffic on foot. It is dangerous to the student, to the drivers who must avoid them, and to the staff that supervises morning

We have efficient and convenient options in place so students can get to school safely and on time. Those who bypass the procedures are in violation of their signed Agreement of Support. Parents who continue to endanger their children by dropping off in the outside lane may be contacted by Administration for remediation.

For a safe, timely morning drop off:

- 1. Plan ahead Leave home a few minutes earlier to avoid the 8:00 traffic rush. Arriving even ten minutes earlier can mean a quick drop off so you can get on with your day.
- Take advantage of free child care You may drop off as early as 7:30 for free
- 3. Don't stress about being marked "late" Understanding the traffic, we have a little time built in to the schedule before students are marked late. But ultimately, no tardy grade is worth risking your child's safety.

I offer a sincere thank you to the vast majority of our parents who faithfully follow the drop-off procedures. I hope every parent will follow your example, for the safety of all of our students.
